Chart of the Day: U.S. Oil Production by the Numbers

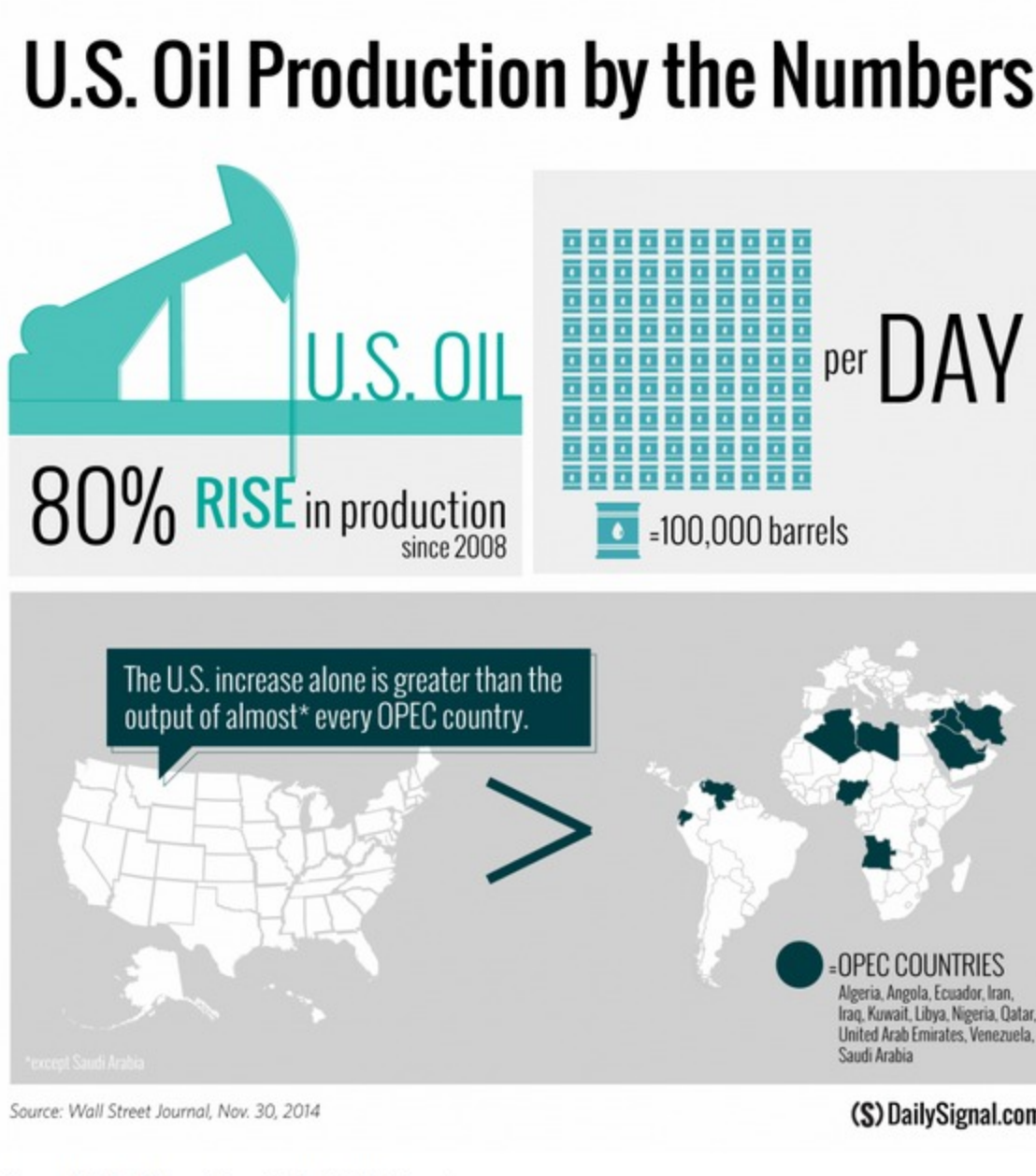
